- We are proud of the Tri-County Brilliant Bricks LEGO Jr. Robotics team that placed 3rd overall in the ND state LEGO tournament which was held at the Betty Englestad Area on Saturday, January 31st. Twenty-three teams from Minnesota, North Dakota, Nebraska, and South Dakota participated in this year's competition, which is open to students from 9-14 years of age, so the kids competed against many students that were much older than they were. This is the youngest team Tri-County has ever fielded, and yet they took 1st place for Innovative Robot Design and also 3rd place for Robot Performance in addition to the 3rd place overall. Tri-County was the only "small school" to place in the top three this year. First place went to Bismarck Elementary and 2nd place went to Omaha, Nebraska. The 3rd place team has the possibility of being invited to the National Invitational which will be held in Dayton. Ohio this year in May. The team should know by the end of February if they will be invited. Many hours of practice on Tuesdays and Thursdays, since September, and some practice during the Christmas break all helped them come together as a team so they could work well together and do the best they could right when they needed to. The coaches, Mr. Baron and Mr. Thompson, are very pleased at how the team has performed this year. The team is especially grateful to Mattracks for providing the t-shirts and registration fees needed in order to be able participate in this wonderful engineering event.
